School Uniform & Expectations

As we look forward to the summer term, I want to take this opportunity to remind all families of our high standards and expectations:

- Full school uniform must be worn to and from school
- Shirts must have a top button that remains fastened at all times
- Shoes must be plain black, polishable, and without logos or tags
- Coats must be black or navy with no logos (not to be worn inside school)
- Hoodies are not permitted
- Bags must be suitably sized in black or navy – small pouches are not permitted
- Hair must be a simple, conventional style, clear of the collar and ears
- No lines in hair or eyebrows
- No jewellery or earrings may be worn
- Trousers must be worn at waist height; a belt may be required to support this standard
- Mobile phones are allowed in school but must be switched off at all times. Students will be required to switch their phones off before entering the school site. If mobile phones are seen in corridors, they will be confiscated.
