

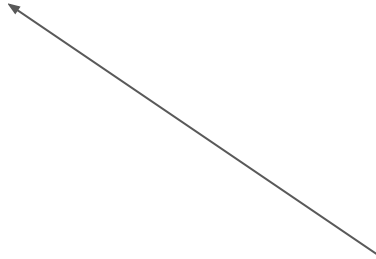

Summary of changes

- Staggered start to the start of the new academic year – each year group having an orientation morning/afternoon.
- Staggered starts and endings to the school day.
- Creation of Year group and Key Stage Bubbles.
- Year group ‘learning zones’ situated across the building - department areas as we know them will not be possible.
- Split breaks and split lunches.
- Health and Safety.

Staggered starts and endings to the school day



- To ensure a safe entry into the building limiting student interaction across year groups and mass congregations in communal and recreational areas.
- Period 1 teachers of Years 7, 10, 11, 12 and 13 will need to be in their classroom by 8:20am, with students expected to arrive by no later than 8:30am.
- Period 1 teachers of Years 8 and 9 will need to be in their classroom by 8:30am with students expected to arrive by no later than 8:40am.

All students must be onsite by these set times. Attendance is compulsory.

Year Group/Key Stage Bubbles

- We will establish year group 'bubbles'. Where possible, year groups will be kept separate from one another, with each 'year bubble' assigned a 'learning zone' within the school. It is anticipated that this will reduce student movement around the school building, in particular at lesson transitions, with classrooms situated within close proximity of one another.



Learning Zones

Each year group will be assigned a specific 'learning zone'. These zones have been designed to reduce the amount of movement of students across the school site:

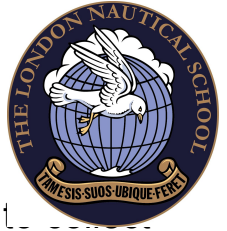
- Year 7 - English Corridor (including Rm 207 as HOY 7 Base and isolation area)
- Year 8 - Languages and Geography (including 211 as an isolation area)
- Year 9 - Maths
- Year 10 - Science/ICT - 106, 105, 104, 103, 102, 101 (LSC as an isolation area)
- Year 11 - Science/Nautical/ICT - 111, 113, 110, 109, 108, 107 (LSC as an isolation area)
- Year 12 and 13 - Sixth Form Centre, Top Corridor through to History and the Mobile Classrooms for the Football Pathway.



Split Breaks and Lunches

- Lunch for KS3 will run from 12:20pm until 1pm, this will be known as period 4A on the timetable. Pupils in KS3 will have **two** periods after lunch known as period 4B and period 5. (Year 7 will have a 20 minutes extra lunch break to get them use to the routines with lunch beginning at 12:00pm)
- Lunch for KS4/KS5 will run from 1:20pm until 2:00pm, this will be known as period 4B on the timetable. They will have one period before lunch known as 4A and **one** period after lunch period 5.

Split Breaks and Lunches



Breakfast service - 08:00 hrs - 08:20 hrs

- This service will be available for Year 7 only and will provide the opportunity for students to collect food that they will consume at break.

Break Service 10:40 hrs - 11:20 hrs

- Breaktime for Years 7, 8, and 9 will run from 10:40am until 11:00 hrs. Year 7 will not be able to collect food at this time.
- Breaktime for Years 10, 11, 12 and 13 - 11:00 hrs to 11:20 hrs
- There will be single cost items and choice will be limited to a 'grab and go' option.

Lunch Service 12:00 hrs - 14:00 hrs

- Year 7 - 12:00 - 12:20 (Left Side Malone Hall)
- Year 8 - 12:20 - 12:40 (Right Side Malone Hall)
- Year 9 - 12:40 - 13:00 (Left Side Malone Hall)
- Year 10 - 13:20 - 13:40 (Right Side Malone Hall)
- Year 11 - 13:40 - 14:00 (Left Side Malone Hall)



Health and Safety

- Increased signage and sanitization dispensers in every classroom.
- School playground to be split to support the separation of year group bubbles.
- Partitioning of main toilets.
- Increased cleaning across the school. Cleaner onsite all day with regular (logged) cleaning of both the student and staff toilets throughout the day.
- Increased supplies of PPE available to support travelling on public transport (if required). This will be available if a staff member or students forgets or loses their own PPE.
- Updated risk assessments.

What should I do if my son displays symptoms?

What to do if you or your child has any of the main symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19)

The main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste

If you have any of the main symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19), you must:

1. Stay at home (self-isolate) for 7 days – do not leave your home or have visitors. Anyone you live with, and anyone in your support bubble, must also self-isolate for 14 days.
2. Get a test – get a test to check if you have coronavirus as soon as possible. Anyone you live with, and anyone in your support bubble, should also get a test if they have symptoms. You can get a test at www.nhs.uk/ask-for-a-coronavirus-test or by calling 119.

1 You may be alerted by NHS Test and Trace

2 Isolate for 14 days after close contact

if you develop symptoms

3 Book a test

- Household isolates for 14 days

negative for COVID-19

- Household stops isolating immediately
- You complete 14 day isolation

positive for COVID-19

- You begin new 7 day isolation
- Household completes 14 day isolation
